- -Robert introduces AI (trustee). AI brings greetings on behalf of the EICS Board of Trustees
- -Athletics are up and running, students have brought home some silver medals
- -School photos are done.Retakes are in November (Date TBA)
- -Truth and Reconciliation Week: we have been doing many activities to learn more about the culture and traditions of various Indgenous peoples of Canada
