| 6:44 PM | Principal's Report (by Mr. Stecyk): <br> - As of the 2024-2025 school year, parents will see a new school fee on PowerSchool. A technology fee of $\$ 30$ has been implemented to support devices. It is possible that it could also be used to cover the cost of software such as, but not limited to, Mathletics and Raz Kids. <br> - An increase of over 5\% in school fees requires approval from EICS Board, however it is not anticipated that there will be an increase. <br> - Results of the Assurance Planning Survey have been compiled, the results were really positive. There were three areas of minor concern, none of which pertain to issues with academics or learning. An additional survey was sent out to parents, on this date, to help identify specific actions that can be taken to improve on these three areas. It is encouraged that all parents complete this short survey. Mr. Stecyk and Ms. Cava will be presenting the completed 2024-2025 Assurance Plan to senior leadership on April 10th, there will be more information on the plan at our next JPII School Council Meeting. <br> - Staff of JPII requested that Mr. Stecyk ask the School Council if dinner will be provided for the in-person 3-way conferences on March 19th. - Pathways - the focus has been on phonemic awareness;
combining and breaking apart syllables, identifying initial and end sounds of words. We've started introducing concepts related to money and change in our numeracy lessons.
