We are pleased to offer exciting complementary courses that enhance our student's education. St. John Paul II continues to offer a selection of courses in the arts, athletics, languages, technology and science. We are proud to offer many interesting choices that appeal to the diverse interests of our 21st century learners, while remaining a faith-centered, Catholic school.

*Please note: Complementary Courses may include additional fees on a cost recovery basis for projects, materials or field trips.

Program Name: Sport For Life 7/8 - Full Year

Description: The mission of the *Sport for Life Program* is to provide students exposure to a variety of sport and recreation activities in a Catholic environment with the focus on creating life-long active and healthy lifestyles. Students will have the benefit of building athletic skill, along with leadership qualities in a faith-filled setting. The program is based on the Canadian Sport for Life model, which is a movement to improve the quality of sport and physical activity in Canada through improved athlete training and better integration between all stakeholders in the sport system, including sport organizations, education, recreation and health. *Students will participate in the Sport For Life program for three of their 4 option blocks. If registered for Sport for Life, the student will only choose one other option per semester.*

Cost: \$1115.00 (\$150 non-refundable deposit required to cover cost of clothing.)

Program Name: Musical Theater Program 7/8- On Stage: In the Spotlight - Full Year

Description: The mission of the *Musical Theatre Program at St. JPII* is to provide students an exposure to a variety of drama disciplines, with a focus on musical theatre, in a Catholic environment where we focus on developing our gifts from God: creativity, ingenuity, empathy, leadership, and innovation. This program is based around the fine arts of; drama, music, and dance. Students will have the opportunity to learn and further their skills in singing, dancing, and acting. They will also have the opportunity to create choreography for the productions and have input into the direction of the show. As well, building on community partnerships, and working with experts in various fields. During the program students will be acquiring skills through small, focused works as well as large scale productions. *Students will participate in the Musical Theater program for two of their 4 option blocks. If registering for Musical Theater, the student will only choose two other options per semester.*

Cost: \$400.00 (\$100 non-refundable deposit required to cover cost of Birch Bay trip and clothing.)



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Complementary Course Name: French 7

Description: This course is a continuation of Grade 6 French. (French 7 is a prerequisite for French 8). Students will be increasing their fundamental skills to read, comprehend and speak fluently as well as spontaneously. Students will enjoy partner/group projects and interactive activities to enhance their experience with learning French. Themes in the French 7 program include; **School, People Around Me, Weather and Holiday and Celebrations.** Alberta Education identifies the following <u>benefits to learning another language:</u>

- Improved listening skills and increased cognitive abilities
- Creating a more flexible thinker
- Greater ease at learning a 3rd or 4th language
- Ability to communicate with more people
- Increased understanding of other cultures
- Competitive edge in the job market
- More opportunities to enjoy literature, art, music, theater, sports and travel.

Complementary Course Name: French 8

Description: This course is an extension of the grade 7 program (Prerequisite French 7 course is required). A more in-depth presentation of grammar is made as well as hands on projects/assignments to maximize the students' French language experience. An increased effort is made on being able to read, comprehend and speak fluently as well as spontaneously. Themes in the French 8 program include; **Animals, Clothing, Food and Holidays and Celebrations.** Alberta Education identifies the following <u>benefits to learning another language:</u>

CTF Course Name: Behind The Curtain

Description: In this Patriots Program your child will get hands-on training in the many aspects of staging a musical theatre production, including; set design and construction, sound, lighting, makeup, props, advertising and promotion, and backstage management. Future job possibilities may include: makeup artist, set designer, lighting and/or sound technician, backstage manager, grip, set dresser, construction coordinator, prop designer and maker, special effects coordinator, event planner, promotions director, programs coordinator, television and radio advertising, and graphic artist, just to name a few.

Cost: \$50



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CTF Course Name: School of Rock 7/8

Description: Students will be introduced to the exciting world of rock music. Depending on their ability, students will begin by learning basic guitar chords and strumming patterns on the guitar. From there, students will learn popular songs, eventually playing in small groups. Students may branch out to other instruments, such as drums, keyboards, and vocals. The goal will be to perform for an audience. Songwriting and recording may also be a focus for aspiring songwriters and musicians. Acoustic guitars are provided for use in class, at no cost. Students are welcome to bring in their own electric or acoustic guitars if desired. Fees cover the cost of printed music, guitars, amps, keyboards, strings, picks, straps, and accessories.

Cost: \$30

CTF Course Name: Art 7/8

Description: Students have an opportunity to explore a variety of two-dimensional art, such as pencil drawing techniques, oil and chalk pastel, watercolor, tempera, and acrylic paints. Students will experiment with drawing and shading, painting, and colour blending. Students will also create three-dimensional sculpture using materials such as wire, cardboard, clay, and plasticine. Fees cover course materials such as brushes, paints, specialty papers, and other art supplies.

Cost: \$25

CTF Course Name: Forensics 7/8

Description: In this class, students will investigate and evaluate many different types of forensic evidence, how to collect the evidence using various techniques and how the evidence is analyzed. Students will participate in a variety of labs to put their knowledge to practical use and to prepare for investigating and solving a Whodunit Crime! This course will also analyze the strengths and limitations of forensic evidence analysis, the ethical considerations involved in the use of forensic evidence and explore a variety of occupations and potential career opportunities in the field of forensics.

Cost: \$20

CTF Course Name: Construction 7/8

Description: The CTF construction option provides students with opportunities to explore, create, plan and evaluate different techniques and strategies related to the world of woodworking. Students identify safety hazards in the construction lab. They operate both hand and power equipment appropriately and demonstrate their construction skills by completing various assigned tasks. Students work in a safe environment where they can apply new skills successfully. Students will have an opportunity to demonstrate their comprehensive knowledge and understanding of wood construction including planning, creating, modifying and evaluating progress as well as demonstrate their problem solving skills as they work through their challenge.

Cost: \$70.00



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CTF Course Name: Drama 7/8

Description: In this class students will explore the world of dramatic arts, including games, improvisation, and scripted drama. Skills developed will include movement, voice, and expression. The emphasis here will be on having fun and building self-confidence.

CTF Course Name: Broadcasting 7/8

Description: Interested in film and television production? Want to be a part of a school broadcasting team that will have broadcasts shown on our feature video wall and the Internet? Then CTF Broadcasting at Patriots TV is for you! Learn what happens behind the scenes to create a weekly broadcast on what takes place at St. JP II. CTF Course Name: Photography 7/8

Description: Students will learn the basics of operating a basic, entry level camera and progress to a more advanced SLR camera. Students will also be introduced to the basics of common photo editing technologies used in the workplace.

- Basic Photography Skills (Point & Shoot, Prop Photography, Mobile Photography)
- Photography Editing via Photoshop and/or Photoshop Equivalent

CTF Course Name: Tech Today 7/8

Description: Students will have the opportunity to learn about up and coming technology that exists in the world around them. They will learn about trends in the technology sector and explore introductory tools to learn the basics of different technologies. The course will include an introduction to:

- 3D Design, Modeling and Printing.
- Block Coding and Computer Coding

CTF Course Name: Multi-Media Arts 7/8

Description: Students will have the opportunity to learn about varying forms of media from the three principle channels of media: video, photograph and music. Students will explore an introduction to video editing, an introduction to editing photographs and an introduction to DJings and digital music production.

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CTF Course Name: Style and Self Care 7/8

Description: Students will have the opportunity to learn how caring for their body, minds and selves, leads to an overall, well-rounded life experience. They will learn how to properly fuel their bodies through a balanced diet and exercise, as well as how to deal with stress. Students will have guest speakers to help them learn about how to properly care for their skin, nails and hair. Many of the activities are similar to beginning portions of a high school cosmetology course.

Cost: \$20.00

Complementary Course Name: Outdoor Education 7/8

Description: In Outdoor Ed, students are introduced to skills that are vital when planning a successful camping trip. Within the course, students are encouraged to develop the knowledge, skills and positive attitudes necessary for safe and comfortable outdoor experiences in all seasons. The course is composed of numerous general learner outcomes designed to help students enjoy the outdoors while understanding how to do so in a safe, responsible and environmentally friendly manner. Topics such as equipment choice, use and maintenance, menu planning coupled with outdoor cooking, orienteering, map and compass and basic bushcraft skills will be covered within the course timeframe.

CTF Course Name: Peer Mentoring 7/8

This course is designed to challenge students to build mentorship skills through peer interactions and volunteering opportunities. Students will plan and provide leadership to cross-graded activities, have opportunities to explore service events within the school and community, and develop interpersonal skills by providing support to peers through learning activities. Throughout this course, students will learn the benefits of volunteers in a community as well as the personal rewards available by volunteering (e.g., self-esteem, self-fulfillment, career awareness, employability, enhanced community awareness, health and wellness).

CTF Course Name: Travel and Culture 7/8

This option will focus on developing an appreciation for different countries and cultures around the world. In addition, we will build skills associated with safe, cost effective, informed and responsible travel. Students will be involved in planning sample travel itineraries and sharing their research about countries of their choosing with their peers. We will also focus on learning about the various cultures in our school with an emphasis on language, cuisine, customs and traditions.

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CTF Course Name: Environmental Awareness 7/8

Description: In this class students will learn to appreciate and understand the natural world around them. They will explore what their role is in being a good steward of the world's fragile ecosystems. Students will learn about environmental stewardship, and will seek out opportunities to actively care for the environment of their local community and beyond.

Cost: \$0

Foods 7/8

Description: Students will learn skills about foods and nutrition. Students will review and practice safe and sanitary food handling and safe use of equipment throughout the lab portion of this course. Students will work collaboratively in their kitchens, learning how to select, prepare and serve foods. The fee covers food costs, equipment repairs/upgrades, and additional cooking supplies.
