We are pleased to offer exciting complementary courses that enhance our student's education. St. John Paul II continues to offer a selection of courses in the arts, athletics, and technology. We are proud to offer many interesting courses that appeal to the diverse interests of our learners, while remaining a faith-centered, Catholic school. *Please note:

- CTF courses may include additional fees on a cost recovery basis for projects, materials or field trips. All costs are listed beside the course description
- Each year, students will take <u>three</u> of these CTF Courses, on a trimester basis. Which courses are offered are
 decided based upon teacher availability and expertise in the Spring. Families will be made aware of which
 courses will be offered as soon as possible.

We are optimistic that we will be able to offer a wide range of CTF courses for 2025-2026 However, it is important to note that activities within each CTF course have the potential to change due to unforeseen circumstances.

Course Name	Course Description	Cost
Drama	In this course, students will explore drama as an art and a medium in an atmosphere that is non-competitive, cooperative, supportive, and joyful. Students will foster a positive self-concept through assumption of roles and acquisition of dramatic skills, and develop competency in communication skills.	\$5
Sports Recreation	In this course, we will explore many different avenues of sports and fitness to expose students to a diverse range of activities. We will have field trips and guest presenters booked to teach the students how physical fitness contributes to their overall wellness.	\$30
Foods	This class offers an <i>introduction</i> to working in a kitchen, learning basic techniques such as kitchen and food safety, food preparation, sanitation/cleaning and how to prepare simple healthy recipes you can make at home. We will also discuss potential career options in the Culinary field. Please be aware, some recipes may contain milk, eggs and/or flour. Any allergy concerns should be brought forward to the teacher at the beginning of the year.	\$25
Travel and Culture	This CTF course will focus on developing an appreciation for different cultures in Canada and around the world. We will build skills associated with safe, effective, informed and responsible travel (ecotourism). Ready, set, go! We will "race" to assigned destinations throughout the world. While there, we will discuss the culture, famous landmarks, and complete research and/or complete an activity about that location.	\$5
Digital Innovators	This engaging and dynamic technology course is designed to equip students with the essential digital skills, creativity, and	\$0

	computational thinking they need to succeed in their academic and professional futures. Students will dive into a variety of interactive projects, learning through hands-on experience with real-world applications of technology.	
Evidence & Investigation	Students will have the opportunity to learn about investigation skills and collecting evidence, building skills off of their science curricular knowledge. Students will continue to develop critical observation skills by assessing various types of evidence, and will be asked to make inferences using these facts and evidence.	\$ 5
The Art of Media	Students will explore various ways to create videos and animations. Possible areas of exploration could include photography, stop-motion animation videos, green-screening, and cartoon animation. Students will create a project in response to one or more of these areas of learning.	\$0
The Art of Craft	Students will develop their creativity by taking the lead on an artisanal project plan. They will be responsible for the design, research, planning, and execution of their hand-crafted pieces. Prior to the project completion students will practice and experiment with different crafting techniques, using a variety of materials.	\$15
