Today, Chris continues to farm, both around Nanton as well as in southeastern Saskatchewan. When he's not working on the farm Chris travels the world delivering his message of "If I Can..."

Simply put, if I guy without arms and legs can snowboard, surf, work on a farm and travel the world... anyone is capable of absolutely anything.
