Catholic Education Review

During the week of March 18-21, Elk Island Catholic Schools will be conducting a Catholic Education Review at the school. The review will consist of student, parent and staff interviews, a school-wide walkthrough as well as staff, student and parent surveys.

Strengthening our Prayer Life

One of our goals during Lent will be to strengthen our prayer life as a school. In addition to Morning Prayer, teachers will lead prayer before lunch and at the end of the day. We hope that building a strong prayer life will draw us all closer to God.

Tell Them from Me Surveys

In late February, 248 students completed the <u>Tell</u> <u>Them from Me Survey</u> at John Paul II. The survey helps the school to understand the makeup of our students and issues that they are facing today. It also included the Accountability Pillar questions from Alberta Education. We are only now beginning to analyze the results. Preliminary results show the following:

- Students in this school have a high rate of Participation in Sports with 44% or our students playing at least one sport. This compares with the Canadian average of 43%
- 65% of our students feel accepted and valued by their peers and by others at their school.
- 79% of students at John Paul II have friends at school that they trust and who encourage them to make positive choices. This compares with the Canadian average of 77%.

- 90% of students in this school exhibit positive behaviours and do not typically get into trouble at school for disruptive or inappropriate behaviours. This compares to 87% of Canadian youth.
- 52% of our students are intellectually engaged and find learning interesting as compared to 44% nationally.
- 70% of our students tried hard to succeed as compared to 66% of students across Canada.
- Student marks in Language Arts, Math and Science mirror the national average: 76% in Language Arts (77% in Canada); 73% in Math (76% in Canada); and 77% in Science (77% in Canada).
- 84% of students at John Paul II and 84% or Canadian high school students plan to finish high school.
- 24% of our students also plan to pursue a trade or apprenticeship following high school as compared to 18% of Canadian youth.
- 50% of our students plan to attend Postsecondary after high school.

2014-2015

As we enter the month of March, planning has commenced for the 2014-15 school year. On March 20th the school will hold a Registration Evening for new and prospective students. All grade 8's from Our Lady of Angels are invited to attend as well as other students who wish to take a look at John Paul II. Parents of existing students are also welcome to join us as we outline the programs and activities offered. In addition to a formal presentation about the benefits of a JPII Education, students will have an opportunity to tour the school, view many of our clubs and activities and take a look at our programs. Come join us next fall. It is going to be a great year.

Information will be going home with students in grade 8 at Our Lady of Angels Catholic School and to all current JPII students in grades 9-11 as we prepare for fall 2014 registration. For students not currently attending OLA or John Paul II who are interested in registering, we encourage you to make an appointment with Principal Bill Tonita to begin the process. Towards the end of March, on-line course selection will take place for all students who are registered.

EICS INTRODUCES NEW NSF CHEQUE POLICY

Elk Island Catholic Schools has introduced a Non-Sufficient Funds (NSF) Cheque Policy. As of February 1, 2014 EICS will charge a \$25.00 fee for any cheque returned marked NSF.

This new policy was implemented due to the high volume of cheques being returned NSF. A significant amount of administrative time is required to sort out these cheques, which come from schools across the Division, and reconcile them to ultimately receive payment. 


Where, oh where are the many, many outstanding textbooks and novels from semester 1? Please check your lockers and homes for the countless books that are still AWOL and floating

Here's a song that for me captures the essence of Lent as we walk with Christ in his suffering. Youtube it, it is worth more than a read – it is worth a listen!


40 Days – by Matt Maher

Re: Introducing ACORN Online Payments

Elk Island Catholic Schools (EICS) is pleased to advise that **ACORN Online Payments** is now available for school fees. This convenient new tool is accessible through the PowerSchool Public Portal. Methods of payment include Visa, Visa Debit, MasterCard or Interact Online Debit and there is NO transaction fee of any kind to parents for using this tool.

How do I use ACORN Online Payments?

- 1. Please go to the school website.
- 2. Click on PowerSchool located under Quicklinks on the left hand side.
- 3. Sign in using your PowerSchool Username and Password.
- 4. Click on the Student Fees located on the left hand side.
- 5. Please follow the instructions provided. If you have questions, please contact the school office.

What if I don't have a PowerSchool Account yet?

- 1. Please go to the school website.
- 2. Click on PowerSchool located under Quicklinks on the left hand side.
- 3. Click on Create Account located in the bottom right side of the box.
- 4. Complete the top portion with name, username, password and your email address.
- 5. You will be asked for a "Net Access ID" and "Net Access Password" for at least one child registered in EICS.
- 6. The ID and Password are specific to each individual student. If you do not have these handy please contact the school office for assistance.

What if I have a PowerSchool Account and have more than one child to pay fees for?

- 1. Please log into the PowerSchool Public Portal with your existing account.
- 2. Click on Account Preferences. Then click Students.
- 3. You may add the name(s) of the additional children here.
- 4. You may be asked for the "Net Access ID" and "Net Access Password" for each additional child you wish to add to your ACORN Online Payment account. For assistance in this regard, please contact the child's school office.

Will the school continue to accept school fee payments by cash or cheque?

1. Yes. However, it is our long-term goal to have all fees paid using ACORN Online Payments. Over time, this online payment method will result in cost savings for schools, thereby providing Principals with additional funds and flexibility to allocate resources to areas with the greatest impact on student success.

Dear Parents of the John Paul II Catholic High School Community,

During the week of March 17th of this year, we will be conducting a School Improvement Process in your community. The purpose of this process of gathering, analyzing and synthesizing information is to assist in the creation of a strategic plan that continues to move and improve your school. Our ultimate goal is to impact student learning and to ensure that children are successful.

The School Improvement Process was developed by Alberta Education specifically for Catholic Schools. The process involves gathering data and evidence through surveys, interviews, documentation review, and general observations. To make this a success, we need your assistance. What can you do to help us with the process?

- Talk to your son or daughter about their school experience and how they can contribute to the process
 by speaking with the review team or by taking a survey during this week. All grade 10 12 students will
 be surveyed and some of them will be chosen to be interviewed.
- Let the school know that you would be willing to have a short interview with a member of the team.
