A Message from the Principal

School Fees and the One to One Initiative

During this time of the year, our efforts are divided between bringing this school year to a successful close as we begin planning for next year. The 2016-2017 school year is going to bring with it several significant changes. The first of which is the implementation of the EICS One-to-One technology initiative where we will be encouraging all students to bring their own technology device as was laid out during our information evening back in March. This initiative will allow for a better integration of technology into instruction and will allow for a better foundation of skills in using technology for work-related tasks. We believe this foundation of skills will better help our students as they transition to life beyond high school. As a staff, we have been busy preparing for this initiative through our professional development with the aim of making this transition seamless. Please see our website or contact the school for more information. If you would like to lease a Chromebook from the school, please let us know by May 15.

While we are asking students to supply their own device, we are offsetting the cost of this by a significant reduction in school fees. We will be eliminating the District Material Fee (\$65 for Gr. 9 and \$110 for Gr. 10-12) for next year. We believe this is a great move forward.

Staff Changes at St. JPII for the 2016-2017 School Year

We are just beginning the staffing process for next year. At this point, we will be seeing a few changes. As has already been announced, Tracy Melnyk, our assistant principal, has been promoted to principal and will be moving to St. John XXIII Catholic School for next year. As well, we will be saying goodbye to Mr. Kim, Miss McCallum, and Mrs. Poulin as their temporary contracts conclude. Mrs. Stolk will be leaving us for the year to welcome another child into her family. Finally, Mrs. Lemmens and Ms. Zwicker will be returning to our Science department after their leaves of absence.

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STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES DURING FINAL EXAMS

To increase student success, and academic integrity, the following policies will be enforced:

- Be prepared and know when and where your final exams are.
- Check to make sure you have no conflicts with any of your other final exams.
- Study and get a good night's sleep!!
- Come early and <u>return class text books</u> and review study notes or relax before your exam.
- Make sure to have everything you need for the exam (pens, sharpened pencils, erasers, calculators, extra batteries, Kleenex etc.). These will not be provided for you. You may also want to bring a sweater in case the room is cold.
- Enter the gym 10 minutes before your exam starts (as soon as the gym doors open) and find your exam or class section.
- You will not be permitted to enter with anything that is unnecessary to the writing of the exam. This includes cell phones, hats, back packs, any drinks that do not have a screw top lid.
- There will be a designated room for any backpacks, hats, cellphones etc. that you can leave your belongings in while you write your exam.
- When you have found your exam please sit quietly and listen for instructions from your teachers as to what you need to do (name placement, label sticking, etc.)
- After prayer and once you have been given your cue to start, relax, stay focused, and do your best to answer all the questions to the best of your ability. Take your time and check your work when finished. Conduct the exam in silence.
- Raise your hand to ask a question, use the washroom, or request additional supplies.
- When your exam is finished, check it over and raise your hand for the collection of the exam. If it is passed 1 hour you may be excused. If 1 hour is yet to pass, wait quietly in your desk. You may only leave once your exam has been picked up.
- Exit the gym quietly and through one of the men's change room doors. Please keep your voices down while in the hallways.
- Collect your materials that you dropped in the provided classroom and return any materials to the library that you still need to return. (Textbooks, library books, etc.)
- Have a great rest of your day and start preparing for your next exam.
